Mr. Allen announced Coalinga Regional Medical Center (CRMC) was insolvent and unless something was done immediately would force to close its doors April 30th, 2018 and reached out to communities of Coalinga, Avenal and Huron to spread the word and seek their support. Mr. Allen was currently talking to two agencies that could perhaps provide a bridge loan and hoped for the best. Mayor Leon stated the reason residents were not using the facility was due to the mediocre service and provided him with contact names of agencies that could assist.

Animal Control Officer Hernandez contacted a survey of surrounding cities and our fees were still low. Once a year the city along with County of Fresno holds a vaccination clinic. After a short discussion it was determined the animal control procedure would be reviewed however it was certain that dog owners had to control their animals and not have them roam freely. Animal Control Officer Hernandez was on light duty due to an injury and thus the dog population was increasing in her absence.

Evaluate Feasibility of Proposal to Add Fluoride to Treated Drinking Water Provided by City of Huron - Neal Costanzo, City Attorney/Jack Castro, City Manager/Nick Escandon, SUSP

A lengthy discussion followed on the pros and cons of fluoride in the drinking water with city attorney stating it be best to discuss after completion of new water plant. Mr. Escandon, SUSP, reported the city was not adding fluoride to the drinking water and did not recommend it due to the size of the city and the plant was not monitored <u>manually</u> 24/7. Mayor Leon's intention was not to add fluoride but to assure what they are doing now is adequate to meet the requirements of the State Department of Public Health.

VIII. <u>CHIEF OF POLICE'S REPORT</u>: Chief Turegano reported new police station would be completed in June, 2018. Mayor Leon had access to trees at \$10/ea. for London Plain and Redwood Ash should the city need for new police complex. Chief had received a \$250 donation for landscaping.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:** 1) Mr. Castro reported the Boys and Girls Club was working with USDA on the baseball court and requesting an additional \$7,000 for engineering costs to be added to the \$3,000 allocation for a total of \$10,000. Mayor Leon asked if this was absolutely necessary. Mayor Pro-Tem Tamayo also asked if it was necessary.

City Engineer Manrique reported grey water ordinance was under preparation. The pre-bid meeting for Tornado Avenue project was on 4/24th at 10 a.m. at city hall. The city would need volunteers to do traffic counts for the ATP Technical Assistance application; the United Health Centers would break ground soon; and Caltrans were reviewing the environmental on the alleyways.

Mayor Leon announced the public library has a seed library for those want to plant and in return provide some of their seeds. West Hills College is holding a welding course and encouraged everyone to get students enrolled.
